Concept

Darmstadt Business School, the economics and business faculty at Hochschule Darmstadt, offers a Major in “International Economics and Management” in English language. It aims at

- students from abroad (Exchange Students) who would like to study in Germany
- German students with strong interest in International Economics and Management

The main objective is to develop and deepen the methodological and practical skills of students that want to make a difference in their lives, their organizations and in society.

Courses

Management and Organization / Leadership

This course gives students an understanding of the interdependencies between organization, management and leadership. The main objective is to encourage students to engage with critical, self-reflective, autonomous ways of thinking.

Scientific and Business Research Methods

Students learn how to conduct empirical research and data analysis by writing a research paper hands-on. Topics and data sets originate from different business environments like, e.g., digital market data or firm surveys.

European Economics and Politics

The lecture discusses the motives for as well as economics and history of European integration. It focuses on the way Europe works and the way Europe is governed. Part of the lecture is a trip to Brussels to get into touch with policymakers and other actors.

Optional further courses

Students can choose from a growing number of specialized classes held in English, for example „Renewable Energy Policy“, “Financial Management”, and „Sales Marketing“. For other German courses, we offer examination in English if agreed in advance with the lecturer.

Project Course

Students combine the theoretical knowledge gained in the „International Economics and Management“ major with current practical topics with a high relevance to internationalization of companies and integration of the European Union. The course will be structured as a real project with a focus on teamwork assignments, budgets, presentations and documentation.

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Why study at h_da?

Founded in 1971 Darmstadt University of Applied Sciences (Hochschule Darmstadt) is one of the largest universities of applied sciences in Germany with around 16,000 students, 320 professors, and over 60 degree programs. Students can choose between numerous undergraduate as well as postgraduate programs. Many unique bachelor's and master's degrees are offered in fields such as engineering, architecture, design, computer science, information and knowledge management, media and social work.

Academic excellence for applied purposes

Important features of Hochschule Darmstadt are short periods of study, the efficient organization of courses, a clear practical orientation from the beginning of studies, a strong commitment to research and development in cooperation with partners in business and society, and an internationally-oriented education. The university maintains partnership agreements with more than 100 international universities around the globe. The roots of the present-day Departments of Architecture and Civil Engineering stretch as far as back as the middle of the 19th century, to the "Landesbaugewerkschule Darmstadt". In 2006, the 'Fachhochschule Darmstadt' was renamed as 'Hochschule Darmstadt – University of Applied Sciences', or h_da for short. The 11 departments are situated in five locations within the city of Darmstadt as well as in nearby Dieburg (about 15 km from Darmstadt). All locations are close to student canteens and cafeterias.

Linked up with local companies

Faculties maintain close bonds with partners from economy and industry. As a consequence, the state of knowledge taught is up to date and there are interesting internship places in companies.

Practically orientated studies

Darmstadt University of Applied Sciences is a university that emphasizes practical knowledge. The degree programmes are geared towards direct career entry. All of our professors have worked in the industry at least 5 years before they were called to h_da. This means you will receive expert practical and technical knowledge first hand.

Support by the International Office (IO)

The IO supports you during your entire stay in Darmstadt with several services. Upon arrival a buddy or tutor will meet you at the airport/train station. If you have applied for a room in a student residence and a room has been assigned to you our student residence tutors will help you moving in. Your buddy or student tutor will show you nearby grocery shops and help you buy a SIM card. You'll also receive your student ID card that is at the same time your ticket for public transportation. During the run of the semester the tutors will accompany you to your appointments at the Foreigners' Registration Office for obtaining or extending your visa. Apart from German classes on four different levels and an intercultural panel we are offering a lot of fun activities! Some of them are a welcome dinner, karaoke night, clubbing, and a weekend trip.
